The Holidays bring many exciting activities and traditions. The entire community celebrates some of these traditions, like the Tree Lighting on Monday December 2. Listed throughout this newsletter are many more wonderful holiday events.

The holiday season also means winter is here. Winter weather and poor road conditions are cause for concern with safety. This can directly lead to school closings and delays. Please take note of the information related to school closings and delays published on page 2.

Student safety extends beyond poor road and travel conditions, and we have a few things happening in our schools related to safety enhancements. On Thursday, November 14, 2019, our students and staff participated in a full-scale emergency drill. A full-scale emergency drill exercises multiple components within the school's emergency operation plan. School district administration, local first responders, and emergency management

officials worked together to design the drill. I am pleased to report the drill was a success. It provided useful feedback on our emergency procedures, and allowed students and staff the opportunity to practice for a real emergency.

Recently, all glass at the building entrances and classroom entrances had safety film installed. Next, we are developing a new phone system to allow better communication throughout our buildings and across the district, including phones in classrooms. We are hopeful to have this installation completed in the very near future. Finally, the Lucas Board of Education is exploring the addition of a school resource officer. This project will be a collaborative effort with the Richland County Sheriff and Richland County Commissioners.

In closing, I wish everyone a safe and happy holiday season!

As we approach inclement weather season of the year, I would like to give you information about some factors that go into school closing/delay decisions.

Generally, most the current weather and forecast is the most important factor in decision making. There is communication with our local Township, while County and State routes are also checked. We communicate with other surrounding school districts too.

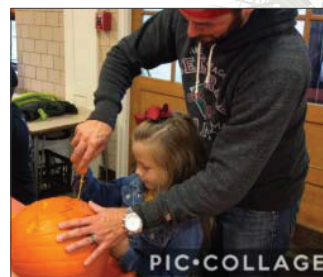
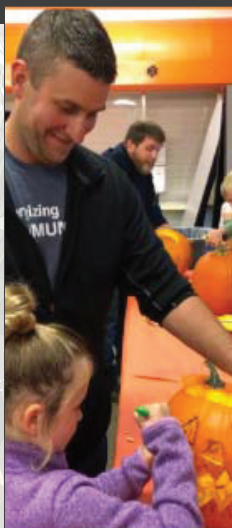

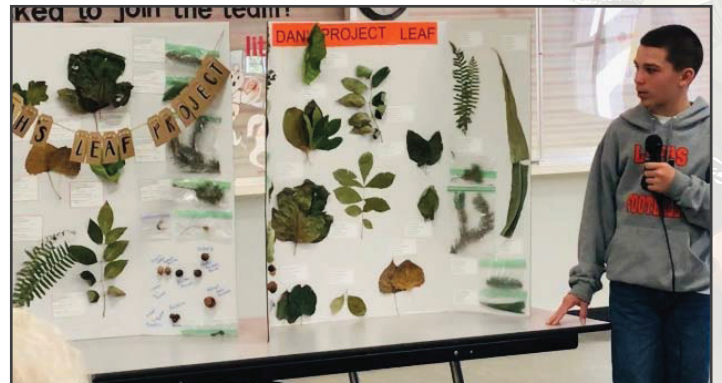
7th Grade Science Project

Lucas FFA Visits UNOH

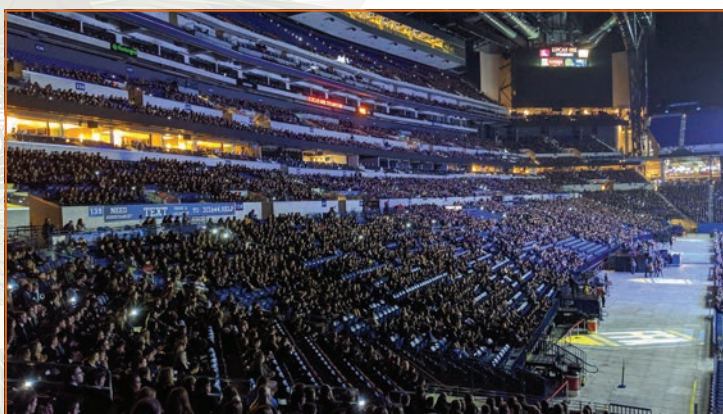

Both science classes have enjoyed, learned and applied many science concepts with the materials purchased through the sustaining fund. Physical science class used the new Lego motor/battery pack kits with existing Lego robotics kits to explore the concept of torque. They had to design and build vehicles that could pull as much mass as possible.

The integrated science classes applied Newton's Laws of motion with their Newton Third law vehicles. Students had to build and describe all of Newton's Laws of motion in action and describe all forces acting on their vehicles.

Finally, the physical science class builds and tested two
