Message from the Superintendent

Superintendent, Mr. Herman

I think we can all agree the 2019-2020 school year will be a very memorable one for our community! From our athletic and academic success to the COVID-19 pandemic that has impacted everyone's life, the events have been unique to say the least. 2020 has been full of surprises and the future will be interesting.

Speaking of the future, Lucas Local Schools are working diligently to prepare for the 2020-2021 school year. While guidance from the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Health was recently provided, our staff needs time to utilize the guidance and work with local officials to develop the best plan for our community's needs. We are committed to developing a plan that promotes student success and safety.

While we do not have a definitive plan yet, we will continue to provide information to our families on a frequent basis for the remainder of the summer. We are hopeful to return to traditional classroom learning, but in reality, we all need to maintain flexibility and the ability to move between these three instructional methods throughout the 2020-2021 school year.

There are great articles related to happenings in each of our buildings, athletic recaps, and a special awards section. Considering we were unable to hold our annual awards events, we wanted to take the opportunity to honor our students' successes. 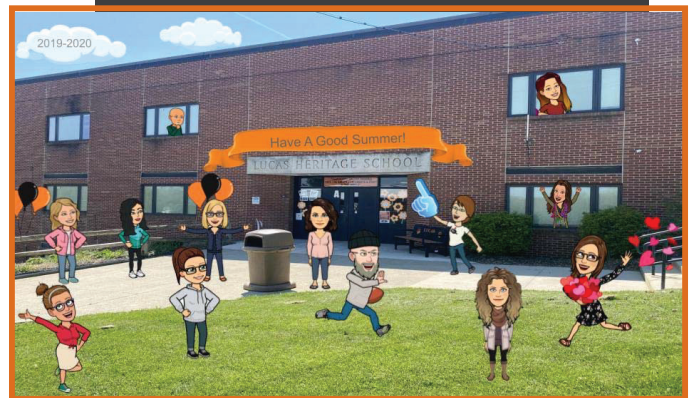

SPORTS RECAPS

The Lucas Boys Basketball team had the most successful basketball season in school history. The team won its 2nd consecutive MBC title going 10-0 for the 2nd straight year. The team set a school record for regular season wins with 21 and set a school record for most wins in a season with 26. The Cubs won a 3rd straight sectional title, 1st district title since 99-00, and qualified for the Elite 8 where they were slated to face Richmond Heights for a Regional Title and a trip to the final 4 before the tournament was canceled due to COVID-19.

Senior Logan Niswander became only the 7th Cub in school history to score 1000 points in his career, in a win over South Central. He set the single game scoring record for points and 3s made in a win over Crestview where he scored 43 points and made 9 3 pointers, and Logan also finishes as the Cubs all time leading scorer with a total of 1335 points.

Junior Riley Gossom set a single season scoring mark for points in a season where he scored 566 points. Gossom will only need 48 points in his senior season to eclipse the 1000 point mark as well. Junior Ethan Sauder broke his own record in a win over McComb where he dished out 14 assists. Ethan also broke the school record for assists in a season with 166. It was a season that ended unfortunately but will be a season that is never forgotten and will be in the record books for years to come.

The Lucas Girls Basketball team had one of the most successful seasons in school history racking up 20 wins and winning a share of the MBC title for the first conference title in 35 years. The Lady Cubs also picked up a sectional title when they knocked off New London 57-27. The Cubs were lead by seniors Jessica Grover, Paige Arnold, Morgan Sweat, and Kayla Hignite. Senior Jessica Grover finished out her historic career as the Lady Cubs all time leading scorer racking up 1576 points over her 4 year career. She also earned her 3rd straight all Ohio honor as she was named special mention all Ohio.

The Lucas High School Wrestling team had a very successful season and saw participation grow as the sport of Wrestling continues to grow at Lucas. First year head coach Ed Finley saw a lot of growth and improvement from all of his wrestlers.

Sophomore Zane Finley had an outstanding Sophomore campaign and became the 1st district qualifier in school history (5th). With that finish at the district tournament he qualified as an alternate for the state wrestling tournament.

Junior Noah Ulery also had a great season as he qualified for his first district tournament. He will look to build upon his Junior season as he moves to his Senior season next year.

Hello everyone, the last several months have been, to say the least, a challenge for all of us! Several pantries in our area have closed, but we are hanging in there. We changed

mostly everything to try to keep volunteers and clients as safe as possible. We have been following all the mandates. All volunteers wear gloves and masks and keep the social distance. The clients are to park in the lot and they are not allowed to get out of their cars.

Since the clients are not allowed to come in, they are not able to sign in on the computer, so a volunteer goes to each car and gets their information, it is taken into the pantry and a volunteer enters it and signs in for the client.

The volunteers shop for the clients food and the food is taken outside in a grocery cart to be put into the trunks of the cars by volunteers, the clients do not get out of their car. There is no contact at all.

The ordering of the food has changed also. We have always been a choice pantry, in other words the clients choose the food they want. Now that is not possible. So instead of choices we order enough of one item for everyone. If we're giving sugar everyone gets sugar, then the next time it might be oil and the next flour, If we don't do it this way since the volunteer doesn't know what the client got the last time, they might get sugar for instance every time. It's been a challenge, but we have gotten feed back from the clients and they say they like what we are doing and our choices have been good for them. We can't thank the volunteers enough for caring for those in need during this difficult time.

We want to thank the Lucas Community for your support, we have been receiving donations and they are really helping us to get what we need. Ordering the way we are now is a little more expensive, but you all have been taking good care of us and for that we are VERY grateful!
