A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Springtime is upon us! This spring there are new and exciting things to celebrate in our community, and many of these great things can be found in our newsletter. From Franklin B. Walter scholar Grant Barrett and his winning of a scholarship, Zane Finley becoming our first state wrestling qualifier in school history, and Lucas graduate David Erwin being honored as a fellow in the American Association for the Advancement of Science, we have a lot to celebrate. We also have a bond issue on the primary ballot for the purpose of building a new school for our community. Finally, conditions seem to be improving related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Speaking of COVID-19. It is hard to believe we are over two years into the COVID-19 pandemic. Throughout this long journey, the support from the Lucas community has been phenomenal. I cannot express enough gratitude for the perseverance of our students, our families, our staff, and the community as a whole. While the Lucas community is always supportive of its children, these trying times have been a strain for everyone. It is inspirational to see this great community rise to the occasion once again to help our students keep learning and growing. While we are not out of the woods yet, hopefully, we will see the end of the pandemic in the near future.

At this year's primary election, a bond issue is being presented to our school community for the consideration of building a new school facility. The total estimated cost of the project is approximately \$35,000,000. The community is being asked to support raising \$27,000,000 of the total price. The other approximately \$8,000,000 will come from a partnership with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC). This property tax based initiative will be a nine (9.0) mill bond issue payable

over a 37 year period beginning in calendar year 2023. It is estimated to cost a property owner about \$26.25 a month per \$100,000 of value. This is lower than originally estimated. Our community has Public Utility Companies sharing a large burden of the tax base. Public Utility Companies are responsible for almost 50% of the tax collected in our community. Our Board of Education has been planning for this potential project for several years. In doing so, we learned that the OFCC requires the district to collect an additional tax in an amount equal to .5 mills. This tax is to be used to maintain the new buildings once they are constructed. The OFCC requires these funds to be in place before they release their share of the project. As part of that planning, the Board of Education has earmarked enough money to cover the .5 mill equivalency permanent improvement maintenance requirement for a project of this nature. Traditionally, school districts include an extra .5 mills with a bond issue for these types of projects. In our case, the district will fund this requirement directly and has not added it to the bond issue. Again, I want to thank our wonderful community for their unwavering support for our students.
