

While the acronym stands for "Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports," it is simply a framework that utilizes a positive approach to discipline with the purpose of improving academic and social outcomes and increasing learning for all students. PBIS focuses on creating and sustaining school-wide, classroom, and individual systems of support that improve the educational environment for all children. With a goal of teaching behavioral expectations and recognizing positive behaviors shown by students, we hope to reduce school and classroom behavior disruptions & educate all students about acceptable school behaviors.



THE CONFIDENCE TO SUCCEED

PBIS is a framework that provides support to students, families and educators. It is our hope that this initiative helps students by focusing on their strengths and building on their confidence to succeed. By working together, parents and guardians, community members, and our school staff can reinforce the necessary skills for productive citizenship among our students.

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LUCAS STUDENTS SHOW CUB PRIDE!



In each of our three buildings the matrix of expected behaviors look slightly different, but the overall message is the same. We state our expectations in a positive way and our staff members reinforce that behavior with rewards and incentives. The elementary and middle schools use the word PRIDE, standing for "Patience, Respect, Independent, Dedicated, and Engaged" as the basis for their matrix. Students are encouraged to follow these standards in all that they do during the school day and beyond. Staff members acknowledge students that showcase these traits with hole punches on their cub pride cards. Once a student has filled in their whole card, they turn it into their teacher for a small prize. All cards are also entered into a biweekly drawing of our Family Fun Packs. Eight students in grades K-5 are drawn every two weeks for the right to take home a bag full of family fun! Throughout the middle school students are also given hole punches in their card when they are caught displaying behavior that relates to our key values. Once cards are completed in grades 6-7, students have a chance to earn rewards throughout the quarter. Our high school students have a matrix that uses the word CUBS. Their key characteristics stand for "Capable, Understanding, Brave, and Skilled." The HS staff members hand out Cub Bucks to students that portray these attributes. Students can save their bucks and buy items in the "Cub Bucks Store," located in the high school office. Our 8-12 grade students can purchase anything from gift cards to school supplies and spiritwear!

Junior students will test their knowledge on four different subjects: English, Mathematics, Reading and Science. College Credit Plus Meeting

January 16, 2024 | Mid-Ohio Educational Services Center

Our annual CCP meeting will be available for parents and students who are interested in participation in the program for the 2024-2025 school year. All students who plan to participate in the CCP program during the 2024-2025 school year are required to attend the annual presentation with a parent and required paperwork to be eligible to participate. Area colleges will be presenting information specific to their institution.

College Credit Plus

A student enrolled at Lucas High School may be eligible to participate in the **College Credit Plus Program** (CCP). This is an opportunity for students to take classes at eligible post-secondary institutions. The purpose of this program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wider variety of options for high school students.

The legislation for this program requires parents and students to receive counseling regarding the program from the post-secondary site and that a letter of intent for the 2024-2025 school year be submitted <u>no later than April 1, 2024.</u>

IMPORTANT: To ensure that a college credit plus course meets Lucas High School graduation requirements, the course must be approved by your high school counselor. Students accepted into the CCP program must complete the college placement test and work with a college advisor regarding course placement. Colleges and universities enrolling students are reimbursed by local school funding for tuition, textbooks, materials and fees. Parents/Students are required to reimburse the school district for incomplete or failed CCP courses and other related charges. Students participating in CCP will be required to provide their own transportation to and from the area college.



Friday, October 13, 2023 the Lucas FFA hosted our annual Harvest Days activities. This year the students have planned a Tractor Display and Lesson, Cider Press demonstration, straw bale obstacle course, cup stacking competition, bingo activity to learn/identify farm animals, pin the tail on the donkey, a petting zoo (calf, ducks, chickens, mini horse, and goats), egg race, pumpkin painting, and ball toss game. There has been a lot of work to plan these activities and make sure all of the items needed are organized and ready for Friday.

In addition, our chapter hosted the District Job Interview contest. This contest provides students an opportunity to apply for a job through an application, interview, and follow up letter and gain valuable feedback that they can apply to future job searches. There were 51 students from 17 different schools who participated. As the host our students who helped run the contest also go the opportunity to earn credit for a district activity that can help them towards a state degree. It wasn't just student help. The Lucas FFA Alumni as well as Lucas Lions and other community members served as evaluators, graders, and interviewers. We couldn't host this contest without the community support.

This year's fruit sale has finished and we had several students show their strong ability in salesmanship. Jordan Tedrow was our top seller, Zac Janeczek was or runner up, and Allyson Arnold was third overall.

In addition, Claire Mudra was our top middle school seller and was actually our fourth overall seller. This fundraiser is a big part of what allows our program to pay for students activities in FFA. Without their efforts our Banquet and the number of trips we take would not be possible. So, thanks to ALL our fruit sellers this year and to all our fruit buyers. The Lucas FFA really does appreciate everyone the helps support and keeps our program going strong.

The Lucas FFA went to National Convention on November 1st through the 4th. Our chapter took a charter bus and traveled with the Buckeye Central, Colonel Crawford, Margaretta and Wynford FFA chapters as well. Students got to visit Huntington University, Shawk Sheep Farm, Fair Oaks Dairy, and a haunted house! In addition, they got to do experience the FFA Mall, General Sessions, a Rodeo, and everything that goes with the National Convention experience. At Fair Oaks Dairy, we got to see a 72 stall rotary parlor and a double six Lely robotic milking parlor. Both of these parlors we at one site and they have several sites. At this farm, there are people giving guided tours, bus drivers, and more all working on a farm in ways that students don't normally associate with Ag. All in all, we had a great time and would encourage students to attend next year. We would also like to thank the Lucas FFA Alumni and Lucas Lions club for donating funds to help offset the cost of the trip for students to be able to attend at a reduced rate.
