Students are reminded that all class dues and school fees must be paid in order to purchase tickets. If a student is bringing an out of school guest, they will need


MATH NEWS

Tristen Arnold (7) and Morgan Sweat (7).



We can now produce vibrant, full-color copies on 8.5 x 11 or 11 by 17 inch paper for 50 cents per image. Our new machine also scans and emails for no cost at all. Images can be saved or retrieved using a USB flash drive. We also just reduced our fax fees down to \$1 per fax no matter how many pages. So make sure to visit your branch library for your fax, printing, scanning and copy needs.

Adults and teens won't want to miss our new "Escape Room" program on Monday, April 23. Search for clues, find hidden messages and solve the mystery before time runs out! We have two distributions each month so volunteers needed for the month is about 120.


