

- an original copy of his/her birth certificate,
- social security card,
- most recent immunization records,
- and proof of Lucas residency (mortgage statement/lease agreement and/or utility bill with current address listed on the bill).

Kindergarten screening will take place in August, 2021 prior to the start of the school year. More information will be provided at a later date.

HIGH SCHOOL WINTER SPORTS

Wrestling - Wrestling had another successful season as they had 9 HS wrestlers this year. Junior Zane Finley was a District Qualifier for the 2nd straight year and earned 1st team All MBC. Junior Noah Langston qualified as a District alternate and was recognized as Honorable Mention MBC.

Girls Basketball 8-11 (3-5)

The girls basketball team was very small in numbers this year but battled every game usually only having 6-7 girls healthy to play. They won 8 games and saw Sophomore Shelby Grover break the single game scoring record (40). The Lady Cubs finished tied for 3rd place in the MBC and look forward to a great summer to build for next year.

Boys Basketball 19-8 (9-1)

The Lucas Boys Basketball team finished the season with 19 wins which is tied for 4th most in a season all time. The team won its 4th straight Sectional Title, 3rd straight MBC title, and back- to-back district titles which hasn't been done since the 98-99 & 99-00 seasons and is only the 2nd time in school history. The Cubs were a defensive force this year setting the school record for lowest defensive scoring average. The Cubs only allowed their opponents to score 41.37 points per game. Senior PG Ethan Sauder became just the 8th player in Cubs history to join the 1000-point club and finished his career with 1039 points which puts him 7th on the all-time scoring list. The Cubs experienced a lot of adversity this past season and came together and played extremely hard night in and night out to exceed expectations for this season. The '20-'21 Cubs basketball team will go down as one of the better teams in Lucas Basketball History and the '21 Senior Class (Ethan Sauder, Ethan Wallace, Riley Gossom, Lane Harper, and Cameron Kegley) will go down as one if not the most successful class to ever play Basketball at Lucas High School. 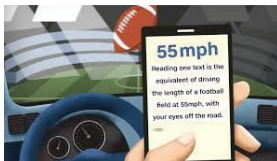
A day that changed Riley's life forever, but also a day to thank a seat belt.

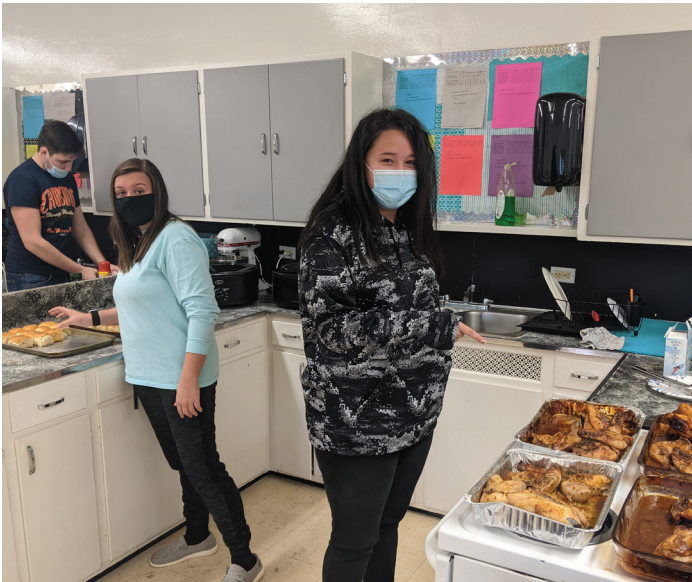
