Welcome Superintendent Bradley A. Herman

The Lucas Local School Board of Education recently hired their new Superintendent.

After former Superintendent, Dan Freund, informed the Board of his resignation at the end June, Linda T. Keller, Superintendent of Mid-Ohio Educational Service Center (Mid-Ohio ESC) served as Interim Superintendent through the end of August. Mid-Ohio ESC also facilitated the Superintendent search process with the Lucas Local Board of Education. The position was immediately posted statewide on June 30, 2017, and after a thorough process, Bradley A. Herman was hired by the Lucas Local Board at their Special Board Meeting on August 28, 2017.

Mr. Herman comes to Lucas with a small town, rural community history. He has been Superintendent at Beacon Hill Community School for the past three years and has previous leadership and teaching experience at Southeast Local Schools. He, his wife, Kelly, and three sons live in Mount Eaton.

Mr. Herman's three-year contract began on September 1, 2017. The Lucas Local Board of Education is pleased to warmly welcome Mr. Herman to the Lucas community.


School Lunch Prices Increase

LUCAS AREA FOOD PANTRY

September, 2017

The Lucas Area Food pantry is made up of all volunteers.

We get deliveries in on the Friday before our Saturday distributions.

The volunteers on Fridays and Saturdays consist of community volunteers and client volunteers.

HELPING HAND

Clients are people who are going to receive food from the pantry.

When we got started back in 2009 some of our clients started asking if they could help in some way, they said they wanted to be able to give back for the food they receive. We told them they do not have to do anything to receive the food it is free. They said they understand but they want to give back what they can and to help us help others.

That's the way it's been from almost the beginning.

On Fridays and Saturdays about one third to one half of our volunteers are clients.

We could not run the pantry if it were not for the client volunteers.

It takes about 30 people on Fridays and 40 people on Saturdays,
which is about 70 volunteers for each pantry.
So, each delivery and distribution of about 70 volunteers
about 23-35 are client volunteers.
We have 2 pantries each month,
so that means each month about 46 -70 clients are volunteers at the pantry.


