
Lucas Schools Tax Levy Renewal: November 5

The Board of Education has placed an Emergency Levy Renewal on the November 5th General Election Ballot. This five-year tax levy was first approved by voters in May of 2010, then renewed in November of 2014 for another five years. The levy generates \$961,000 each year and is used for the general operations of the District. This is NOT an additional levy but a continuation of an existing issue.

Most recently, the district transferred general operations funds into the Permanent Improvement fund to replace the visitor bleachers at the football field, repair masonry at the high school, and maintain the asphalt on the drives and parking lots. The general operations funds have also kept technology current and has provided each student with access to a Chromebook. The continuation of this tax levy will maintain our current level of funding for future improvements and operations of the district.

Showing Cub P.R.I.D.E. Through PBIS

Lucas Elementary School has begun to implement a program known as P.B.I.S. (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports). Over the summer months, a PBIS committee, formed by teachers of various elementary grade levels and Mrs. Case participated in training, examined past discipline data, and held collaborative conversations related to the core values found within the mission statement of Lucas Elementary.

The committee came to an agreement upon district-wide expectations that the school would use as a tool for teaching expected behaviors. The acronym, PRIDE, was decided to be used to present these core values. The letters in the acronym stand for Patient, Respectful, Independent, Dedicated, and Engaged. Through these core values, universal expectations were created for the various locations around the school, including hallways, buses, classrooms, the cafeteria, dismissal location and many more.

As the summer came to an end, the committee lead the rest of the staff through the training, revealing the core values, behavioral matrix, location posters of expected behaviors and noise levels.

The school year rolled out with the elementary student body being led through around the school grounds, and even loading onto a bus, to discuss, learn and practice the behavioral expectations. Through modeling, reteaching, and reinforcement, students have continued to review and be reminded of these expectations as the first quarter has passed.

This approach to managing behaviors is a positive one. Through daily Cub PRIDE shout outs over the morning announcements, students are acknowledged for exhibiting the expected behaviors.

We invite you to take this opportunity to talk to your child about the expectations at school and the importance of continuing to demonstrate PRIDE behaviors. Ask your child what Cub Pride means to them. With your continued support and involvement, Lucas Elementary will remain a school where students can excel, academically as well as behaviorally.



Growth Mindset Mrs. Case, Principal

During the 2019-2020 school year the Lucas Elementary and Middle School Staff are participating in a book study reading The Growth Mindset Coach: A Teacher's Month-by-Month Handbook for Empowering Students to Achieve by Annie Brock and Heather Hundle. Through monthly staff meeting discussions, the book study will provide staff with tools to take back to their daily practices and work to teach students about the benefits of keeping a growth mindset.

Throughout the school year, the brain will be discussed focusing on its ability to be shaped and grow. There will be discussions of how it is possible to strengthen our brains and become smarter. Students will be guided to embrace challenges and mistakes and to praise their efforts, and perseverance rather than specific abilities or talents. The goal is to support the development of a growth mindset in our school community.

People appear to be more motivated to persist when challenged, try harder and embrace learning opportunities when they learn they have the power to grow their brain. These actions can then lead to higher achievement and a more optimistic view of learning. You can reinforce the ideas behind growth mindset at home by leading discussions about the power of the word Yet. Learning something new can take time and if they struggle at a task or do not fully understand something at first, it is not the end of the story. Talk about how they just do not know how to do it or understand it Yet! Yet tells our children that they have time to learn from mistakes and work through challenges using different strategies or a different path. If your child tells you, "I don't get it." or "I just don't understand." add the word Yet to the end of their sentence. It is amazing how one little work can be so powerful.

Students Attend Ashbrook Lecture

On Tuesday, September 17th, 23 Lucas High School American Government students attended a luncheon and lecture sponsored by the Ashbrook Center at Ashland University. The Ashbrook Center's mission as described on its website is "to restore and strengthen the capacities of the American people for constitutional self-government." They do this with an emphasis on the importance of understanding the founding documents of the United States – the Constitution, the Declaration of Independence, the Federalist Papers, and others.

This particular day was Constitution Day. The guests at the event included state representatives and senators, judges, Ashbrook Scholars (a rigorous, top-rated academic program for a select group of undergraduate students majoring or minoring in Political Science or History at Ashland University),

and high school students and teachers from the area. Each guest was treated to a delicious luncheon and was given a complimentary pocket Constitution.

The featured speaker was Patrick Fischer, a justice of the Ohio Supreme Court. His topic was, "Close Encounters of a Judicial Kind," which detailed the importance of state judges in the American legal system. The audience had an opportunity to write questions for Justice Fischer during the presentation and, after his lecture, he answered them all. Lucas High School student, Michael Bland, was quoted as saying, "I thought it was really interesting. I learned a lot about state judges that I didn't know before." Bland also mentioned that he remembered the justice talking about the important role Ohio played in the presidential election of 2004.

The library maintenance department collaborated with the building's owners, Monroe Township, to demolish the wall, clean it out, replace the studs, hang new drywall and clean the carpet. We also had to redirect water outside by adding downspouts, digging underneath the post office dock, sealing out the source of the water and pouring a concrete contour to move rainfall away from the building. We also had to bring in professionals to verify the stability and safety of the building. It was all quite an undertaking. We sincerely apologize for the gap in service in August, but we simply had no other option.

Now, we're excited to be back and we're thrilled to offer some great new programs this fall. Children won't want to miss our "Scaredy Cat Ball," which is fun for the whole family on Tuesday, October 29 at 5 pm.
