





We also had a pet supply drive and were able to donate to them 343 lbs of dry dog/puppy food, 60 lbs of wet dog food, 205 lbs of dry cat/kitten food, 23 lbs wet cat food, 243 lbs cat litter, 30 lbs dog treats, 3 lbs cat treats, 46

dog toys, 34 cat toys, 78 collars/leashes, and a few trunk loads of newspapers! We also had a



huge prize raffle. We awarded over 150 prizes during the raffle. The students earned raffle tickets by meeting their teacher's AR point goal each quarter. Students were able to earn extra tickets by earning points beyond their goal.

We, the GCFB official and LAFP director, met in each of the Congressman's offices. We gave them information about why people are in need and shared some stories about some families in need. The main information the LAFP wanted to explain to the Congressmen/women was how pantries could not do what they do without the Food Banks.

For instance in 2017 in the LAFP were to have purchased their groceries from a retailer, such as a grocery store or big box store we would have had to spend \$241,000.00 for the groceries for that year.

By purchasing those same groceries from the GCFB we spent a little over \$16,000.00. The LAFP told the Congress people they could see that the pantries would not be able to do what they do without the Food Banks.

As you just read it takes a lot of financing to do what we do.
