Lucas Branch Library



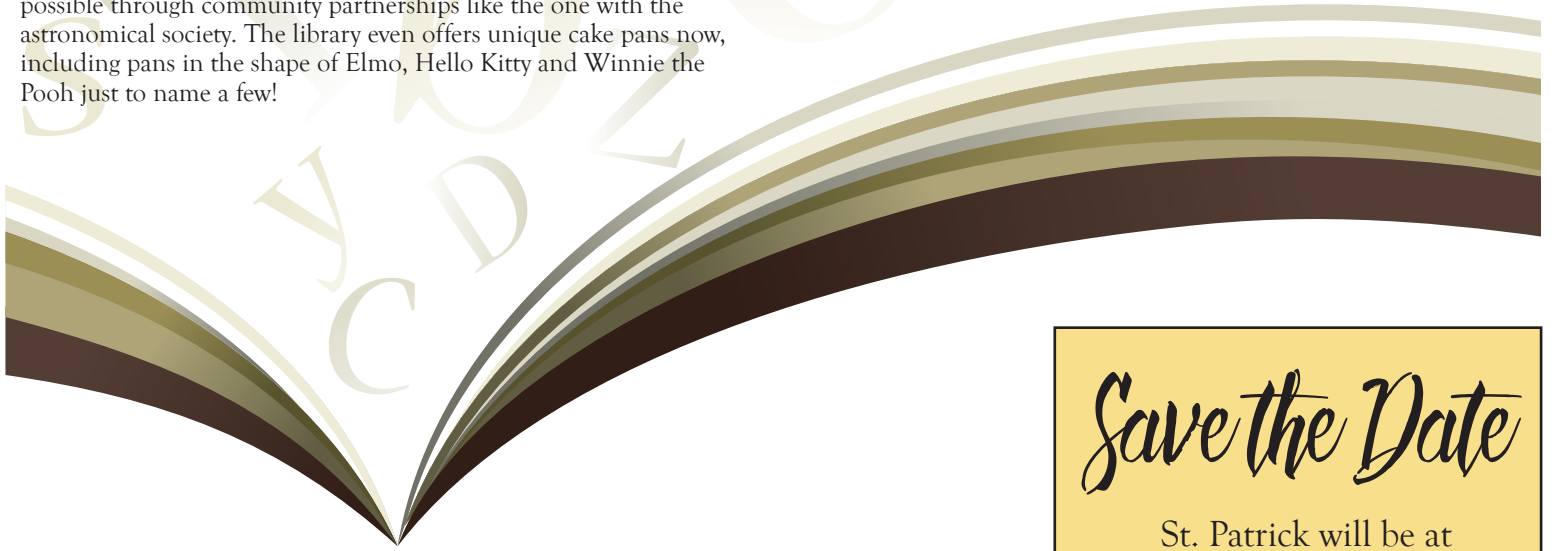

The library is excited about the warm-up and, as always, is here to support the Lucas community and help you find the educational and recreational resources you need. We're also thrilled to be gearing up for a space themed Summer Library Program which will launch in June with amazing programs and prizes. Exploration will even "take-off" as early as March 21 when our Main branch will host the Space Science Institutes "Discover NASA" exhibit. Families will not want to miss this special event featuring an inner-space experience, hands-on interactives, green-screen activities and even a wind tunnel! The exhibit will run through May 30.

Speaking of space, did you know that you can borrow high-powered telescopes from the library? Thanks to the Fran and Warren Rupp Donor Advised Fund of the Richland County Foundation with help from the Richland Astronomy Society, the library is excited to offer 4.5" Orion StarBlast telescopes for your night sky viewing pleasure. The telescopes join the library's list of non-traditional items you can borrow like Wi-Fi hot spots, blood pressure cuff kits and air quality monitors, many of which are made possible through community partnerships like the one with the astronomical society. The library even offers unique cake pans now, including pans in the shape of Elmo, Hello Kitty and Winnie the Pooh just to name a few!

Children of all ages will want to check out our Teddy Bear Picnic on Tuesday, March 12. 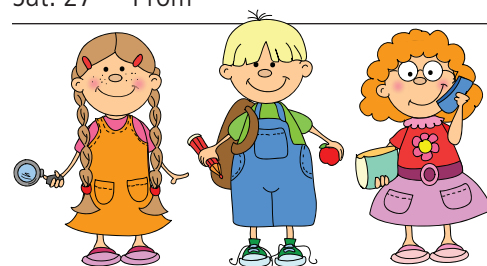

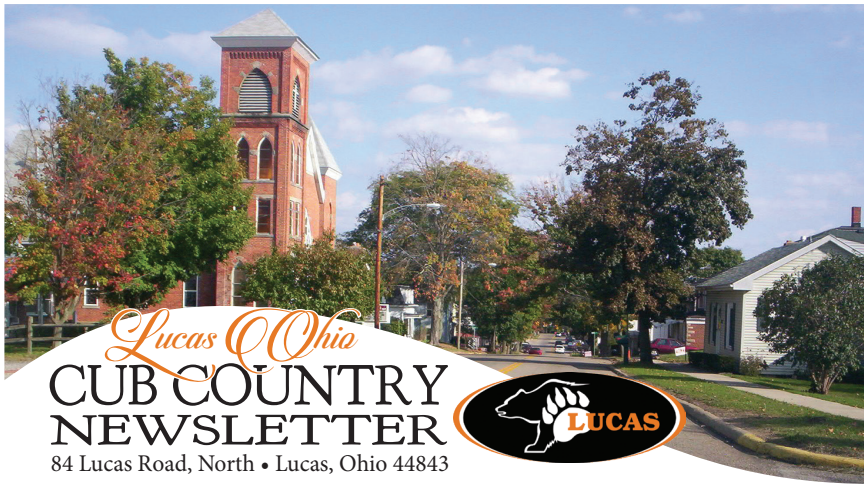
